## May 2020 Staff Report

#### Recommendation:

#### **COVID-19 Response and Organizational Update**

Tahoe RCD continues to respond, plan, and react to the constant changes related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Tahoe RCD office remained closed throughout May and staff continued to telework while conducting some field activities. Our travel clearance letter for staff conducting "essential services" was modified to allow contractors to conduct monitoring work. Staff continued weekly all staff "Coffee Chat" virtual meetings to provide updates, share program information and just be together socially by sharing favorite new show or where you want to travel next.

The Governor announced that the state moved to Stage 2 which gradually reopens some lower risk workplaces including some retail, manufacturing, and logistics businesses. Businesses and employers in those sectors were able to reopen Friday May 8th. Staff compiled COVID-19 Cleaning, Disinfecting and Social Distancing Protocols for Tahoe RCD using guidance from state, local and national public health officials (sent to the Board on 5/26). Personal protective equipment has been purchased for the office including gloves, reusable masks, hand sanitizer, and a remote thermometer. Safety signage has been posted on all entrances into our office. As staff start to return, we will modify the protocols as necessary to accommodate the protocols in actual practice. Staff have been asked to have safety at the forefront, but also move through this challenging time with compassion and support for their colleagues, themselves and the community. This is the first time any of us have navigated a pandemic like this and we can only assist one another with kindness and empathy. Staff will still be able to telework through Stage 3 and possibly Stage 4 depending on direction from public health officials and when schools re-open. Teleworking is and will remain an option for staff after Stage 4 through supervisor approval of an alternate workweek schedule.

#### Tahoe Conservation Partnership/Joint Powers Agreement

Tahoe RCD and the California Tahoe Conservancy have been meeting regularly to discuss the potential scenarios and contingency plans for the 2020 field season. On May 14th we decided to hire on a reduced workforce to safely accommodate social distancing, transportation limitations and priority project. The full forestry crew (5) and a reduced land management crew (2) started on June 1st. On June 18th Tahoe RCD and the Conservancy will discuss the potential to hire additional land management crew members and the restoration crew.

#### Polaris Creek Feasibility Study Project

The consultants are working on processing the final report and incorporating final comments from the Advisory Group.

#### Outreach and Partnership Development with Public and Private Partners

Here is a summary of interactions with partners and working groups in May:

- Met with Meghan Kelley, NTCD, to discuss potential partnership opportunities, sharing personnel for project implementation and future funding needs.
- Attended the Tahoe Chambers webinar on Economy & COVID by Dr. Christopher Thornberg, Founding Partner of Beacon Economics, LLC.

Stimulus drill projects to California Tahoe Conservancy – included JM design, Polaris Creek planning, AIS prevention and control, stormwater infrastructure maintenance program, pavement condition continuation, land management needs for JM, forest management plan for JM, invasive fish control

#### Partnerships/Collaborations

<u>California Tahoe Alliance</u> – Conversations continue on strategy based on budget restrictions and other COVID-19 related priorities and evolving realities. The Legislature returned May 4th. The Alliance submitted a support letter for Assemblyman Garcia's AB 3256, which is the Economic Recovery, Wildfire Prevention, Safe Drinking Water, Drought Preparation and Flood Protection Bond Act. This bill is expected to be added to the June 3<sup>rd</sup> hearing agenda. The Alliance continues to watch SB 1348 (Stern) and AB 2621 (Mullin). The Alliance is working on a priority list for EIP and potential stimulus funding from State (overlap with Conservancy) and Federal funding.

<u>California Association of RCD</u> – CARCD community has been extremely supportive and useful community to share ideas and get answers during the COVID-19 response. The CARCD board president has been hosting weekly calls as an open space for DM/ED's to gather and share. Staff attended the fifth of six-monthly interactive webinars on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion hosted by CARCD and led by the Center for Diversity and the Environment specifically tailored for California RCD District Managers. CARCD held a grant collaboration meeting to discuss grant opportunities and how to leverage the association and each other on potential applications.

#### **Programs and Projects**

#### **Landscape Conservation**

#### Tahoe Network of Fire Adapted Communities

FAC program staff facilitated work plan meetings with North Tahoe and North Lake Tahoe fire districts to document any changes for the 2020 season and discuss roles and responsibilities. An additional work plan meeting was held with south shore partners and the North Tahoe FPD and North Lake Tahoe FPD staff who are providing services in the south shore in 2020 to accomplish the same and secure the necessary Memorandums of Understanding to work in each other's districts. Defensible space inspections and curbside chipping are available in some areas already and will be available Basin-wide by June 15th. Community work days will be offered in all fire districts in 2020 and run by either the Tahoe Douglas FPD or North Lake Tahoe FPD fuels reduction crews. 2020 Target Hazard Areas where community assistance will be available have been identified by all fire districts and will be posted to the map here: <a href="https://www.tahoelivingwithfire.com/get-involved/">https://www.tahoelivingwithfire.com/get-involved/</a>. Program staff will have the opportunity to present to the basin-wide 2020 seasonal defensible space inspectors at their TRPA tree removal permit and PRC 4291 training on June 9th, to support opportunities to connect residents to the Tahoe Network for neighborhood scale wildfire preparedness.

FAC program staff are planning for virtual community outreach and engagement events, kicking off with a Tahoe Fund-sponsored free screening of the documentary, Wilder Than Wild, hosted by the Tahoe Art Haus and Cinema next week with a virtual Q&A with Chief Schwartz (North Tahoe FPD), Forest Schafer (California Tahoe Conservancy), and the film maker on June 11th at 5pm. Other virtual events being planned include a Neighborhood Leader Meet and Greet, Tahoe Network of Fire Adapted Communities Info Workshop (who are we, what do we do, how to get involved), and the Tahoe Home Retrofit Guide Workshop for the public, tentatively scheduled for July 28th.

Staff have initiated 2020 contracts with print, online, radio, and television media outlets to run the Fire Public Information Team's wildfire prevention and preparedness campaign. In addition to ads developed

in 2019, this year the campaign will include Take Care wildfire preparedness ads developed with Tahoe Fund.

## May 2020 Staff Report - Stormwater

#### **Recommendation:**

It is recommended the Board read and file this staff report.

#### Stormwater Monitoring

The spring season ended May 31, 2020 and was the busiest season for stormwater monitoring this water year. 32 sampling events over 12 precipitation events occurred. All sites except Lakeshore and Pasadena were sampled at least once. Lakeshore and Pasadena did not flow sufficiently for sampling. General tasks such as data entry, management and preliminary QAQC continues as usual.

Management staff received a memo from the 7 implementing jurisdictions (Implementers' Monitoring Program or IMP) that provide funding for the stormwater program. They were asking for clarification on certain programmatic concerns such as the budget, invoicing, the efficacy of the data management system, and the number of sites that are monitored. A response to the memo was issued and we are looking forward to working through their concerns smoothly. A meeting to discuss this will occur in lune.

On May 21, 2020 staff gave an hour-long webinar to the National Association of Conservation Districts on stormwater monitoring, management, and agency collaboration in the Tahoe Basin. There were approximately 50 participants and exceptional engagement during the question and answer period. The link to the presentation replay is: <a href="www.nacdnet.org/general-resources/webinars/">www.nacdnet.org/general-resources/webinars/</a>.

#### Pavement Improvement Planning Proposal

A revised pavement proposal was submitted to CTC on May 29, 2020 and was well received. CTC had reserved a space in their budget to fund the project so we are hopeful that we will be awarded the funding after the review process.

#### **Water Conservation**

Analysis of 10 years' worth of water consumption data from the North Tahoe PUD has begun. Staff will be identifying the top 200 water consumers for single-family residential, multi-family residential, and commercial properties during the summer season, and the second homeowners that consume no water during the winter season. The top 200 in each category will receive letters urging them to participate in a program to install smart water meters, and the homeowners that don't use their homes in the winter will receive letters encouraging them to winterize their homes for maximum energy efficiency.

Staff is still waiting to receive data from STPUD for CSLT public parcel consumption so that efficiency can be calculated before and after installation of smart meters last summer.

#### Wildlife Crews

The stormwater program manager is slowly taking over management of the wildlife crews. This is in an effort to fill funding gaps but also to begin development of a technical services program. Wildlife surveys have begun and are quickly ramping up for the summer season.

#### Stormwater Resource Plan

The final Enhanced Stormwater Resource Plan (ESRP) was submitted to the CTC on May 19, 2020. It outlined the need for improved project and program assessment protocols and recommended the use of results chains and revised performance measures (PMs). Next steps may include working with EIP working groups to inform them of the suggested process, help them develop results chains and appropriate PMs for their focus areas, and integrate the new process into the EIP Update and eventually into LTInfo.

## May 2020 Staff Report

#### **Programs and Projects**

#### **AIS Prevention**

#### Watercraft Inspection Program (WIP)

Due to health and safety orders from the states of California and Nevada in response to COVID-19, inspections and decontaminations for aquatic invasive species (AIS) were not available at all this month. As state orders across the country were relaxed to allow for more activity, Tahoe RCD prepared for a phased approach to opening the inspection stations. Two inspection stations (Meyers and Truckee) were prepared for minimal staff with the anticipation that all four full-time, year-round site supervisors might return to work in June for limited operational hours. Services were prioritized to align, and encourage compliance with, the current understanding of Health and Safety orders as well as travel restrictions within the basin.

Launch sites and marinas were able to open for previously inspected vessels towards the end of the month which brought even greater pressure from the public to provide inspection services. The program created a comprehensive operational plan for the inspection stations to coincide with that of the District. All appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and cleaning supplies were procured to facilitate implementation. Inspections are expected to begin in early June for locals who can verify their vessels are registered in the basin. A reservation system will be employed to limit congregation of public and provide order for the limited staff at each station.

Program staff continue to prepare equipment, permits and processes for the other sites. We anticipate continued restrictions on social distancing to significantly impact the way that operations continue.

The start-date for the Outreach Specialist position continues to be delayed, but is expected to begin in early June to help address the hundreds of emails and phone calls received each day.

#### **Outreach and Education**

Questions and emails are being answered by RCD staff, as well as Jeff Cowen and Tom Boos at the TRPA. Program staff continue to attend AIS Outreach committee meetings and coordinate summer activities and events.

#### Additional Group and Partnership Involvement-

Lake Tahoe Aquatic Invasive Species Coordinating Committee: Tahoe RCD attended and contributed to meetings of the AISCC.

Truckee-Tahoe Regional Prevention Program: Due to budgetary concerns, the town of Truckee has officially made the decision not to continue enlisting the program for watercraft inspections at Donner Lake. Instead they have moved to a self-inspection program but will also accept Tahoe inspection seals. Tahoe RCD continues to facilitate to a minimal degree by providing access to previously created materials, providing direction to inquiries from the public, and working to enhance and develop our new relationship. In anticipation of this possibility, the approved budget for 2020 already addresses this outcome. If normal operations continue at the Truckee inspection station, the hours of operation will be reduced to more accurately address the needs for Lake Tahoe visitors only.

#### **AIS Control**

Preparation of the draft IS/IEC/EA Environmental Review and Permitting for Lake-wide Aquatic Invasive Plant Control continues. An agency draft document will be circulated in June, with the document and technical reports to be circulated to the public In June-July.

Aquatic invasive plant control work is proceeding this month at infestation sites in California and Nevada. ### May 2020 Staff Report

#### Recommendations

It is recommended that the Board read and file this staff report.

#### **Restoration Program**

#### Johnson Meadow Phase 1

Restoration planning is entering its first summer and the public engagement phase. The Project Development Team met via phone, during the monthly planning call in May, to strategize alternatives to public events to conduct outreach and field work plans. The PDT will determine the path forward in June based on state and local guidance. A Johnson Meadow specific e-mail list has been created and contacts are being gathered, and flyers have been posted around the meadow and will be replaced as needed. Despite the Covid-19 crisis Phase 1 planning is on schedule.

#### Johnson Meadow Operations

Management and operations actions in the meadow have continued while accounting for all safety needs and following State of California and local guidelines. Planning has commenced for potential public events when permitted as well as other management actions including: the resolving of remaining encroachments, management of illegal camping, signage, and access and pathway planning.

#### Continued Response to Covid-19

The Restoration Program Manager will continue to monitor the situation and direct actions and planning processes as appropriate in accordance with State, local, and district guidance.

#### HR 7073 Background

CSDA is asking special districts to take action and send letters of support to their federal representatives for H.R. 7073 the "Special Districts Provide Essential Services Act".

This bill is a direct result of special districts' COVID-19 advocacy. Congressman John Garamendi began collaborating with CSDA on the "Special Districts Provide Services Act" in late April after his constituent special districts reached out with great concerns regarding financial hardships. Now, all special districts are asked to build on this support.

Share with your federal representatives why this bill is important and urge them to support it. A sample template letter (link to letter on Take Action page) for you to send your U.S. House representative, U.S. Senator Dianne Feinstein and U.S. Senator Kamala Harris. Please send via USPS mail. Please also send a digital copy of your letter(s) to <a href="mailto:advocacy@csda.net">advocacy@csda.net</a>. Let me know if you need any assistance with sending your letter.

#### What the bill does:

- Provides special districts access to the Coronavirus Relief Fund: States would be required to direct 5 percent of future appropriations made under Section 601 of the Social Security Act (established in CARES as the Coronavirus Relief Fund). The state would have 60 days from the time the U.S. Treasury releases the fund to transfer the funds to special districts. The state would grant the funds at its discretion.
  - This 5 percent is not intended to subtract from cities and county's portion of the funding, but rather 5 percent from the state's allocation under Section 601.
- Special districts would be determined "eligible issuers" for the Federal Reserve's Municipal Liquidity Facilities Program.
- "Special District" would be defined. There currently is no federal statute defining the term.
  - The term 'special district' means a political subdivision, formed pursuant to general law or special act of a State, for the purpose of performing one or more governmental or proprietary functions."

Please continue this momentum. Signaling this support now will be critical to the bill's next steps and the intended goal of its inclusion in the next COVID-19 state and local government relief bill.

### Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Budget

#### Recommendation:

Review and approve the FY 20/21 Budget

#### **Discussion:**

Program Managers developed their program budgets and the Executive Director and Director of Finance and Administration completed the budgets for the General Fund and Admin. The annual budget was reviewed by Harold Singer, as a representative of the Finance and Operations Committee on May 28, 2020. A few items of note on the budget, which were discussed with the Finance and Operations Committee:

- This budget shows a \$80,819.89 dollar deficit. There are multiple factors that play into this deficit including:
  - o No interest revenue expected for 20/21 now that we do not bank with the County
  - A reduction in grants that allow direct billing for administrative staff and operating costs which increases hours and costs being charged to Admin and General Fund
  - Low admin rates allowed/accepted for all grants, ranging from 5 -15%
  - Must update website to meet State standards for ADA compliance by January 2021. This is budgeted at \$15,000.
  - o Payroll has increased with the implementation of the new salary ranges
  - Various increases in operating costs, impacting Admin and General Fund such as rent, and telephones
- Can Tahoe RCD handle this level of deficit this year?
  - Yes, for the short term (See attached Cash Balance)
- The Board should discuss strategies and tactics to mitigate this in the future and plan for the potential impacts of a recession. Here are some options to consider:
  - Devote resources to obtain a Federally approved Indirect Cost Rate (ICR)
  - Discuss options to make our money grow including savings accounts, investment opportunities with municipal advisors or other interest-bearing options.
  - The Management Team has started to strategize on program and project funding. A long-range budget, strategic plan and/or business plan will be developed through the process to guide grant applications and project development.
  - Advocate for higher administrative and operating percentages with funders at the State and local level.


